HAVE A COMPLAINT?

PROBLEM WITH A REALTOR® BUT NOT SURE WHERE TO TURN TO? LET OUR CODE OF ETHICS ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM POINT YOU IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION!

The single, most outstanding characteristic that sets REAL-TORS® apart from other real estate practitioners is their willingness to accept and abide by the Code of Ethics of the National Association of REALTORS®. The Code, which was first adopted in 1913, is a living document, responsive in its content to changes in the law and industry. The Code has been revised several times through the years to reflect current developments in professional real estate practice. The term REALTOR® has come to represent competency, fairness, and high integrity. These qualities stem from voluntary adherence to an ideal of moral conduct in real estate practices.

But even with the best intentions, planning and preparation, occasional disagreements arise between REALTORS® and/or between REALTORS® and their clients or customers. As civil litigation becomes increasingly costly, time consuming and burdensome, there has been a trend among private parties to settle disputes and conflicting claims through alternative means.

The Realtors® Association of Northwestern Wisconsin offers the public and its members a vehicle to economically expedite ethics complaints and/or arbitration requests without going to court. If a monetary dispute arises from a real estate transaction or if you believe a REALTOR® may have acted in an unethical manner, seek a resolution through us. 

REALTORS® Political Action Committee Overview

RPAC stands for the REALTORS® Political Action Committee. A PAC is a legal means by which interested individuals with common goals, like a trade association, ban together for the purposes of political action.



The best way to positively impact issues such as property taxes, health care and protecting the rights of property owners is through RPAC, a real estate professional's vehicle for political action.

What does RPAC do?

As a real estate professional, RPAC is your PAC. It is also the real estate industry's vehicle for political success. REALTOR® volunteers raise contributions from other members across the state. These funds are then pooled together and contributed on a nonpartisan basis to public office candidates who support housing and real estate interests.

Seventy cents of every dollar raised stays in Wisconsin for state and local elections, and the remaining money is transferred to the National Association of REALTORS® PAC for contributions to federal candidates.

RPAC facts

- All fundraising efforts and contributions to candidates are administered by a board of RPAC trustees, representing each local board and all areas of the state. Decisions made by the trustees are submitted to the WRA board of directors.
- Funds are disbursed on a nonpartisan basis to Democrats and Republicans alike, based on issues and support of the REALTOR® legislative agenda.
- RPAC is one of the largest trade-association PACs in the world and in Wisconsin.

Why should RPAC interest you?

RPAC is a critical business partner for REALTORS®. Up to 4,000 bills are introduced each session in the state Legislature, and elections determine who will be voting on these bills. RPAC helps to elect the people who write the laws with which you and your business must live. Through extensive research and ongoing monitoring, RPAC keeps real estate professionals informed, involved and influential regarding the legislative decisions that are important to the industry.

Does RPAC buy votes?

RPAC does not buy votes. Candidates and public officials are honorable people whose votes are not for sale. However, by helping to elect public policy decision-makers, RPAC assures REALTORS® the opportunity to present their views and be heard. RPAC fully complies with all state and federal election laws.

How To Apply For A Grant

- Contact a local clergy member, the County Health and Human Services Department or a RANWW member.
- Identify repair needed and submit an application. Include <u>two</u> repair bids and photos of the identified area for repair.
- Grants are awarded in \$1000 increments. If repairs are beyond this, applicant is responsible for the remaining balance.
- Grants are awarded twice a year typically May and September.
- Grant recipients will be alerted by mail to the submitting clergy, Human Services employee or RANWW member.
- All applications are kept confidential.
