ONE ELECTION ENDS, ANOTHER BEGINS

The fall election is (finally) over. No more political ads, YouTube videos, and campaign staffers knocking on your doors. Now that the election is over, it's time to pay close attention to how the parties are going to govern in Washington, D.C. and in Madison.

In Congress, Republicans will have a razor-thin margin in the House while Democrats will have a 50-50 split with one seat in Georgia yet to be decided.

In Madison, Governor Evers will return for another four-year term, as will Attorney General Josh Kaul and Secretary of State Doug LaFollette. For the next two years, the GOP will likely have a veto-proof majority in the state Senate (Alberta Darling, a member of the Joint Finance Committee announced her retirement after 32 years in the Legislature, a special election may be called or the seat will be filled during the spring election on April 4th). The GOP also picked up a previously Democratic seat in the 25th Senate as former state Representative (and RANWW REALTOR®) Romaine Quinn was elected.

The Assembly will not have a veto-proof majority, but the Republicans did pick up three seats, all in our jurisdiction. Karen Hurd won the open 68th Assembly race, Angie Sapic won the open 73rd Assembly district and Chanz Green was successful in the 74th.

December 1st brings with it the beginning of the next election, slated for Tuesday, April 4th. Town boards, city councils and school boards will be elected as will one statewide seat on the Wisconsin Supreme Court.

All politics are local. Nomination papers can be circulated thru 5pm on Tuesday, January 3rd. Take a moment and look at your local races and see if you would be a good fit to run for office, or support someone else. Having REALTORS® in local offices keeps our voice strong.

POSSIBLE REFERENDUM IN LAKE HALLIE

After successful referendums in neighboring communities, the Village of Lake Hallie is looking at a possible referendum this spring, but not for buildings or new staffing.

Rather, the village is looking at a possible referendum to give salary increases to existing employees, fixing many of the village roads and retiring debt incurred when the village incurred costs from the town of Wheaton leaving the fire protection district.

Like many municipal governments, levy limits are hampering governments to pay for services, pay raises and purchases of new equipment.

The board has not made a decision on whether to hold a referendum this spring and if they do, how much they will ask for as some debt from a previous referendum will be paid off in the next two years.

Bayfield County Passes Building and Apartment Construction Plans

Cinnaire Solutions won approval to construct a 50-unit housing project on 9.5 acres in Washburn. The \$10 million project is also available for tax credits from WHEDA to help with costs to develop the county-owned parcel. The deadline to submit their proposal is January 27th.

The historic St. James Hotel in downtown Bayfield will also receive \$250,000 in funding from WEDC for renovations and repairs.

MY THOUGHTS: WHY RUN FOR LOCAL OF-FICE

As we have just watched this year, the fall election is over. The balance of power in Congress is pretty close to 50-50 for each party. In Wisconsin, Republicans picked up an open Senate seat (RANWW REALTOR® Romaine Quinn) in the open 25th Senate. They had a supermajority in their chamber until 32-year veteran Roberta Darling resigned. Their supermajority will have to wait until either a special election is held or the seat is decided on the spring election ballot April 4th.

Assembly Republicans picked up three open seats, all in our jurisdiction. The 68th, 73rd and 74th wins keeps a supermajority in that chamber short two seats.

But that's national and state politics. As the old saying goes "All politics are local". Decisions make at the federal and state level travel down to the local town or village board, city council and school board. And that is where you can make a difference.

I know what I speak of. I was elected to two school boards in two different cities in two different decades. The rewards outweighed anything else.

Having a REALTOR® sitting on a town board, village board, city council or school board is invaluable in terms of local decision making where taxation and land use issues are made. It's having a seat at the table (in The Chair!). It's the ability to bring your unique perspective to a local governing body.

NAR OFFICIALS MEET WITH WHITE HOUSE ON HOUSING SUPPLY, AFFORDABILITY

NAR Chief Executive Bob Goldberg and 2023 NAR President Kenny Parcell met with officials from the White House along with other industry leaders to discuss housing supply and affordability.

Some of the suggestions included reducing fees for first-time homebuyers, providing more housing choice vouchers and providing incentives for more people to participate in that program that is targeted direct and immediate support for renters and potential homebuyers.

NAR continues its focus to make clear to policymakers that the government must invest in boosting the nation's housing supply in order to create more selection and allow more people to become homeowners.

Beyond homeownership, NAR is stressing investment in new construction, making zoning reforms, and providing tax incentives to promote more housing investment and conversion of unused commercial space into residential units.

NAR is working to promote the Neighborhood Homes Investment Act and the Affordable Housing Credit Improvement Act, both designed to increase affordable housing options thru the Low Income Housing Tax Credit and private investment to rehab 500,000 homes over the next ten years.

The 2022 RPAC campaign is in the home stretch.

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
