FALL ELECTION APPROACHES

The primary election is behind us, and the November 8th general election will soon be at hand. Reports from those knowledgeable indicate that Wisconsin could see political spending for all offices and all parties between \$300 and \$700 million!

That means someone who is trying to run for a seat in the Assembly or Senate and is not aligned with all the various third-party funds that top-of-the-ticket candidates and incumbents are, will find it harder to get their message across.

WRA and members of RANWW have spent time this summer interviewing candidates for open seats in a number of Assembly and Senate districts.

They join other members across the state who have participated in selecting real estate and land use candidates for the 30 open seats in the Wisconsin Legislature.

Candidates participate in a 20 minute interview by members of WRA's advocacy team, REAL-TOR® members are then asked their opinion on who would make the best candidate in each seat and those recommendations are noted and passed on to the WRA RPAC Trustees for their endorsement.

Once they are all selected, the results are compiled into the WRA Voters Guide which will be sent to all 18,200 WRA members. When we ask you to support a candidate with your Direct Giver dollars, you can be assured that the candidate has been vetted by WRA and your fellow REALTORS® and is worthy of your financial support.

WRA, along with members from the REALTORS® Association of Northwestern Wisconsin and the La Crosse Area REALTORS® will be interviewing the candidates for the open 3rd Congressional seat September 19th.

Candidates Brad Pfaff and Derrick Van Orden will each have 45 minutes to answer a number of questions put to them by WRA staff.

Just like state candidate interviews, members from both local Association's will discuss the answers and make a recommendation to WRA staff then will be relayed to NAR, who will make the final decision on an endorsement.



TWO TALES OF RURAL BROADBAND

As TDS Telecom continues to install fiberoptic cable under most of the city of Eau Claire, other more rural areas of the region are beginning to see what millions of dollars of grants, state and federal funding and private investments can be with fiber coming to areas that had to contend with speeds that were much too slow for pretty much any use.

With the grant dollars comes some frustration as some homes and businesses receive high speed, while residents down the road or across the road watch and wonder when their turn will be. Slowly, it will be everyone's turn to have the same fast broadband that is found only in cities.

Then the bad news: The Federal Communications Commission has rejected the long-form applications from LTD Broadband and Starlink under Phase 1 of the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund. That represents nearly a billion dollars of investment in the areas shaded in light green on the map below. And that could set rural projects back for quite some time.

FINAL LOTS IN DOWNTOWN ASSIGNED FOR DEVELOPMENT

Menomonie Market Food Co-op is working with the Redevelopment Authority to reduce the value of its building that will soon be under construction from \$6 million to \$4 million. This lot, which is currently being used as a parking lot is next to the new Children's Museum that will open in January and across the street from the new Andante mixed -use apartment building. Behind the co-op will be two other mixed use buildings with underground parking and apartments in five story buildings.

While across the river, new low-income apartments will begin construction this fall as will buildings and a park in the Cannery District.

BARRON TIF DISTRICT TO SUPPORT NEW KWIK-TRIP, OTHER DEVELOPMENT

The City of Barron is looking to a TIF district to support the construction of a new Kwik-Trip and other development opportunities along its main route on Highway 8. The TIF District from La Salle Street to downtown will be an area where the tax base is set and the property taxes from the valuation exceeding the base goes to pay for development of the land within the district.

Funding from the district will offset costs of installing lights at La Salle and Highway 8, improve water and sewer lines, purchases of land for future development, parks and other amenities.

The district has 47 parcels in it with many smaller lots on one end of the proposed district and much larger lots on the other so there are ample opportunities to find projects that will have the lot size to be acceptable.

Before any of this can happen, there are a number of steps that have to be undertaken. The State of Wisconsin must approve it, as well as a Joint Review Board and the Barron City Council.

Those approvals could take some time, in the meantime, planners can decide the best fit for projects if they receive approval to move forward. The 2022 RPAC campaign is in full swing.
